

Beadazzled Project: Beaded Scarf Cuff



Purple cuff made of Czech seed beads, Violet Swarovski crystals, and silver tone beads and spacer bars by Dotsie Mack.

Supplies:

- Two spacer bars (the spacer bars used in the sample above have 5 holes)
- Stretch Magic - make sure to pick a size that works with the diameter of your bead hole.
- Approximately 110 4mm beads. If your scarf is thick, you may want to make your scarf cuff longer by adding more beads on each strand.
- 40 3mm Beads.

- Spacer beads -the quantity will depend on your pattern.

Step 1:

Cut a piece of Stretch Magic 12 inches in length and string beads on the cord in the pattern you want until you come to the half-way point.

Step 2:

Thread Stretch Magic cord through the spacer bar and continue stringing the second half of your pattern.

Step 3:

Thread Stretch Magic through the second spacer bar and tie off the ends using an overhand knot. The spacer bar should hide the knot of your stretch magic. (See instructions for tying off Stretch Magic under "Cords" section of the How-To portion of website.)

Repeat Steps 1- 3 until each strand is strung. If using a 5-hole spacer bar, repeat each step 5 times.

Tip:

Create unique variations of this beaded cuff design by stringing a pendant onto the middle strand of beads, as shown in the example to the left. Not only will this add a nice weight to your cuff, keeping it in place, but it will also serve as an eye-catching focal point for your accessory and transform it into a "scarf necklace!"
