How to finish leather cords (part two)

Professional Tip: Greek leather is high quality leather which soft and flexible.

Leather cord or Other Cords

There are more options for ending pieces strung on leather cords.

- A. Another way to end pieces strung on leather (or other similar cords) is to create a button and loop end with a large bead or toggle tied to one end and a loop created to fit that bead on the other.
- B. If the leather fits through the rings of the clasp you wish to use, feed the cord through then wrap a thin guage wire (think 24 ga) around the cords to make a tidy finishing touch.
- C. Deer lace and imitation suede is flat. Foldover crimps will be more suitable. These ends have loops on them to attach a clasp of your choice using jump rings or split rings.
 - 1. Place a dot of glue on the crimp end.
 - 2. Lay the cord end in the crimp.
 - 3. Use your chain nose pliers to *fold* the sides of the crimp so that they overlap and grip the cord in place.
